

FOOD SERVICE PROGRAM

The school district will operate a food service program in each attendance center. The food service program services will include hot lunches, through participation in the National School Lunch Program, a breakfast program, and supplementary foods for students during the school day. Students may bring their lunches from home and purchase beverages and incidental items.

A "School Lunch Meal Pattern" will be made available to students and free or reduced-price lunches will be provided for students who cannot afford the price of "School Lunch Meal Pattern" lunch.

School food service facilities are provided to serve students and school personnel when school is in session and during school related activities. Facilities may also be used under the supervision of the director of food service for food service to teacher or other school personnel groups; parent-teacher meetings; civic organizations; outside groups renting the facility; and senior citizens, with permission of the superintendent and in accordance with board policy.

The food service program is operated on a nonprofit basis. The revenues of the food service program will be used only for paying regular operating costs. Supplies of the food service program, including those provided by the United States Department of Agriculture, shall only be used for the lunch program.

The board will set, and periodically review, the prices for school lunches and milk. It shall be the responsibility of the superintendent to make a recommendation regarding the prices of school lunch, school breakfast, and milk.

It shall be the responsibility of the director of food service to administer the program.
